9 I understand that, you know, there's always
10 editorializing going on in any newspaper article,
11 but where the author of the article has indicated
12 to be Katherine Gregg, where she says "amid new
13 revelations," do you know what the source of the
14 information was that Miss Gregg wrote about?
15 A. I don't follow the question.
16 Q. I'm sorry. Again, where Miss Gregg states, "Amid
17 new revelations concerning then-House Speaker
18 William J. Murphy's 2009 role in arranging a meet
19 and greet for Curt Shilling at the Massachusetts
20 State House," where she states "new revelations,"
21 do you know what her source was?
22 A. I do not.
23 Q. Is it true where Miss Gregg says that you arranged
24 a meet and greet for Curt Shilling at the
25 Massachusetts State House?

1 (QUESTION AND ANSWER READ BACK)
2 Q. I understand that I'm asking you to testify as to
3 Mr. Schilling's state of mind, but was that a
4 question that you asked either Mr. Schilling or
5 Mr. Zaccagnino when you were approached?
6 A. No.
7 Q. When did Mr. Zaccagnino and Mr. Schilling approach
8 you? Possibly Mr. Schilling, I know you said you
9 weren't sure.
10 A. I first met Mr. Zaccagnino in the fall of 2009.
11 I don't have a specific date.
12 Q. And how were you contacted by Mr. Zaccagnino?
13 A. I wasn't. I met Mr. Zaccagnino in an office.
14 He was with Mr. Corso and Mr. Fox, and they
15 introduced him to me.
16 Q. And when was this?
17 A. The fall of 2009.
18 Q. In the fall of 2009. Who contacted you to come to
19 that meeting?
20 A. Nobody.
21 Q. All right, so there was a meeting in the fall of
22 2009?
23 A. Well, it wasn't a meeting with me. What
24 happened was 2009 at the Rhode Island State House,
25 I was leaving for the night. I went to see

2 and greet or an introduction with Curt Shilling
3 with the Massachusetts Speaker at the time.
4 Q. And who approached you to arrange that?
5 A. To the best of my recollection that would have

7 Q. And why couldn't Curt Shilling in that he has a

13 MS. CONCANNON: Objection to the
