## To Chairman Solomon:

Please consider this written testimony in support of community solar legislation that would take an important step forward for Community Solar in Rhode Island.

Our company, DEPCOM Power, is a privately held, top five utility solar engineering and construction contractor in the USA. We have built over 60 utility solar plants across the USA and operate 1.5 GW of utility solar for our customers nationwide.

Our growth is due to the strong partnerships of utility solar developers like Turning Point Energy who share our vision to build clean, cost-effective, and efficient solar energy that empowers our local communities and reduces energy costs for ratepayers.

Together with Turning Point Energy, we've developed and built some of the largest and most successful community solar projects across the USA, including 26 MW of utility solar projects here in Rhode Island in North Smithfield and West Greenwhich.
