To Chairman Solomon:

Please consider this written testimony in support of community solar legislation that would take an important step forward for Community Solar in Rhode Island.

Oak Square Partners is a solar project development company. Since our formation in 2016, we have developed projects in both the RI REGrowth program and the Community Net Metering Pilot program. We support this proposed expansion because it will increase access to energy savings to a greater number of RI households while also providing a viable path to financing for project developers.

The primary purpose of community solar, which was passed into law in 2016 by the General Assembly, is to allow members of a community the opportunity to share the benefits (savings on their electricity bill and powering their household by clean energy) of solar power even if they cannot install solar panels on their property. As Rhode Island continues to move forward toward its clean energy goals by 2020 and beyond, we believe that this legislation is a critical step in that it will allow all Rhode Islanders – whether renter or owner, whether rich or poor – to be a part of our clean energy future.
