Peter Hewett, Bristol, RI – House Bill No 5604, An Act Relating to Education – **AGAINST**

I respectfully submit this written testimony in opposition to the House bill 5604. The amendments proposed by the sponsors of this bill I view as an abomination. The added language is evil enough as it is, but to extend this comprehensive sex education drivel to children in the 6th, 7th and 8th grades is beyond the pale.

I really do not know what motivates the sponsors of such legislation to believe it is at all appropriate to engage young children at the grade school or even high school age for that matter in such sensitive, explicit and potentially inflammatory subject matter.
