RE: 2021 – H5155 – ENTITLED, AN ACT RELATING TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND HOSPITALS - MENTAL HEALTH LAW

Dear Chairman Casey:

I write to support H 5155, which would include licensed advanced practice registered nurses (APRN), certified in psychiatric/mental health, as qualified to certify the need for mental health treatment in certain patients.

The revisions in this bill to the Mental Health Law, R.I. Gen. Laws §40.1-5, would be instrumental in supporting the work of our behavioral healthcare providers. Securing the responsibilities of APRNs in the service delivery system can help address the severe physician shortage our providers suffer statewide. More efficient use of both physician and APRN time would benefit patient care by providing more effective management of patient services and establish a safer environment for both provider staff and patients.

The testimony of APRNs certified in psychiatric/mental health in court would be tremendously beneficial in managing physician time, which can be devoted to patient care rather than waiting in court to testify. We believe that certifications should be made by one physician and one APRN.
