Dear Chairman Casey:

On behalf of the R.I. Dental Association, I submit this letter in support of passing House Bill 5160. This bill deals with the issue of non-covered services. You will see from the attached history of non-covered services legislation, Rhode Island was the first state in the nation to pass this law. Essentially, this law addressed a policy enacted by national Delta Dental in 2008. This new policy required dentists to abide by the fee schedule for any dental procedures they performed on Delta patients, even though Delta was not paying the dentist for the procedure. Rhode Island passed the nation's first non covered services law that clarified that Delta could only dictate the fee on those services they paid for. At least 46 other states have followed Rhode Island and passed a similar non covered services law. This law has been a model for the entire

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Representing Rhode Island Dental Association country. There are now federal versions of the bill pending before Congress.
