
In Rhode Island economies of scale in a 311 system are achieved when ALL 39 communities participate.

IMC (now known as Perform)

Acquired in 2007 and now supported by TriTech

Nearly 50 IMC servers exist state-wide and possibly up to 100. This is not good given available and mature modern technology.

What does IMC do?

Incident and Records management

Mobile data availability for Public Safety

Statistics reporting, crime reporting

A fairly large percentage of Fire Departments use IMC as well.

What IMC doesn't do...

Operate in a web browser like Internet Explorer

20 year old database architecture lends to high maintenance (flat file database)

I personally have tried, with the Police Chiefs IT Subcommittee, to help TriTech evolve IMC.

Used by 37/39 towns state-wide (New Shoreham, Providence), Universities, and State Police.

Where do we go from here?

Support just for towns and state, \$1M+

The Police Chiefs Association, including State Police Colonel O'Donnell, voted unanimously in 2013 to allow the IT Subcommittee to explore other software options for Records Management.

Mission: Rhode Island becomes the first state in the country with statewide RMS.

Overarching problem statewide

Contrary to roads, bridges, sewers, and water lines we lack useable network infrastructure resources statewide.

Analogy I like to use is building the house (deploying applications) before we construct the foundation (first layer network infrastructure).
