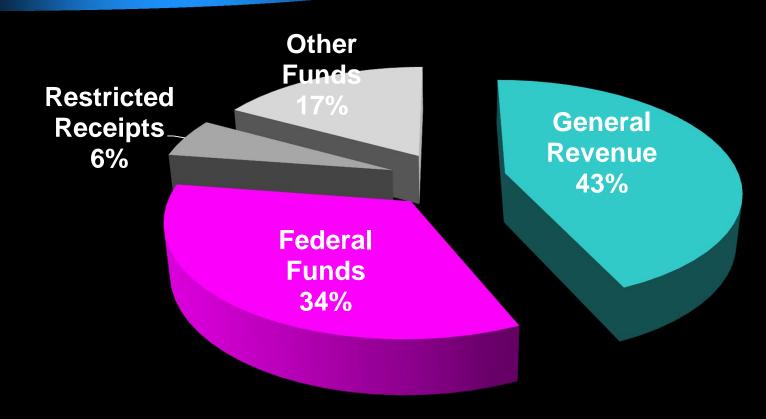
Governor's FY 2012 and FY 2013 Budget

- State agency responsible for:
  - Preservation, protection, development and restoration of the coastal areas of the state
  - Issuing permits for work within the coastal zone of the state
  - Lead state agency for dredging
  - Aquaculture

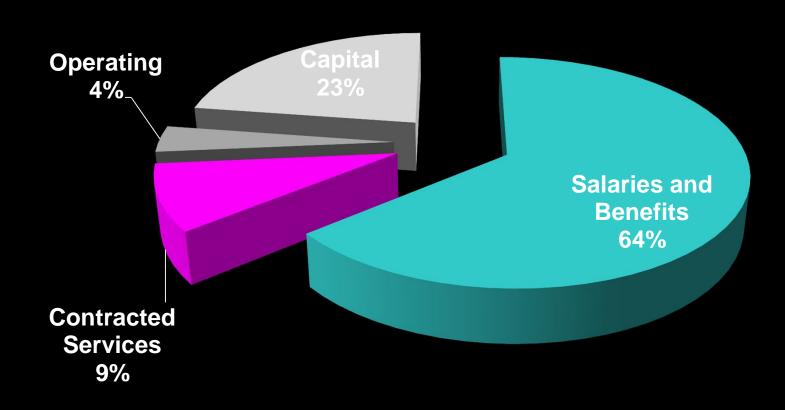
- Administered by a council of 16 members
- Staff consists of:
  - Professional engineers
  - Biologists
  - Environmental scientists
  - Marine resources specialists

- Coordinating and oversight role for other state agencies
- Sponsors coastal zone research
  - coastal flooding, hazard mitigation, and special area management planning
- Public rights of way

- Salaries and Benefits \$3.4 million
  - \$68,082 less than enacted
  - Medical benefit holiday savings distributed
  - 30.0 positions
  - 29.0 positions filled
  - Engineering Tech III position was eliminated at end of first quarter

- River Ecosystem Restoration \$2.0 million more
- Six individual projects
  - 4 projects in the Pawcatuck River area
  - 2 projects in 10-mile River area
  - Restores access to the rivers for migratory fish and restores the surrounding habitat

- Special Area Management Plan -\$16,000 more
  - USDOE funding for feasibility of renewable energy projects in the state's coastal waters

- Federal Grants
  - Funding reflects anticipated FY 2012 award and expenditures
  - Narragansett Bay Restoration \$0.1 million more
  - Aquatic Invasive Species \$41,434 more
  - Aquaculture research \$0.2 million more

- Salaries and Benefits \$3.4 million
  - \$24,897 less than enacted
  - 29.5 positions, 0.5 less than authorized
  - Engineering position elimination in FY 2012
  - Addition of part-time staff attorney
  - \$0.4 million less than Council's request
    - Senior environmental scientist position requested by Council was not recommended
    - Updated retirement rates

- Legal Services
  - Full funding of \$126,000 for Council's contract for outside legal services
  - \$71,784 to add part-time staff attorney in addition to the \$126,000
  - Address underrepresentation of staff recommendations during public hearings
  - Reflects NOAA directive

# FY 2013 Recommendation: Federal Grants

- Federal Grants funding reflects anticipated FY 2013 awards
  - Narragansett Bay Restoration \$59,144 less
  - Aquatic Invasive Species \$12,353 less
  - River Ecosystem Restoration \$0.2 million less –project completed

  - \$0.9 million from RICAP
  - Sediment removal and habitat restoration at Winnapaug and Quonochontaug ponds
  - Maintain previous dredging of Charlestown breachway

- Secure Facility Area
  - \$50,000 to build secure outdoor area to house one of the Council's boats
- Coastal and Estuary Habitat Restoration Program and Trust Fund
  - \$250,000 from OSPAR funds

- All other changes
  - \$0.1 million more
  - Miscellaneous operating expenses
