Personnel

- FY 2013 Revised \$5.1 million
 - >\$47,035 less than enacted
 - ➤ Turnover Savings
 - Currently three vacancies
- FY 2014 \$5.4 million
 - ➤ Governor recommends \$0.3 million more than enacted, largely consistent with the Office's request
 - No turnover included in recommendation or request

Secretary of State's and Board of Elections' Role in Elections

- Secretary of State's Elections & Civics
 Division and Board of Elections are
 charged with different responsibilities
 - Complementary tasks, many of which are mandated by Rhode Island General Laws

Secretary of State's and Board of Elections' Role in Elections

Secretary of State

- Provides municipalities with forms for candidates
- Certifies federal and state candidates for ballot placement
- Provides descriptions and explanations of state referenda in Voter Handbook

Board of Elections

- Supervises all elections
- Prepares state and local referenda
- Instructs and certifies all election officials assigned to polls
- Prepares and distributes poll worker guides and related materials

Secretary of State's and Board of Elections' Role in Elections

Secretary of State

- Publishes guides for candidates, election officials, and voters
- Provides ballot information and polling place locations on website
- Prepares and prints ballots
- Maintains central voter registration system

Board of Elections

- Prepares and delivers voting machines and supplies to polling places
- Conducts recounts
- Certifies election results to Secretary of State
- Conducts voter registration drives

Election Expenses

- FY 2013 Revised \$1.8 million
 - >\$0.1 million less than enacted
 - >\$23,036 less than requested
 - Reductions to outside legal services and postage based on November 2012 election

Election Expenses

- FY 2014 \$1.3 million
 - >\$0.5 million less than enacted
 - > Cyclical
 - >\$50,423 less than requested
 - Reductions to postage and printing expenses primarily reflecting anticipated expenditures for absentee ballots

State Archives

- Comprehensive archives and records management services for all public records of the State
- Local government records program
 - Provides advisory and technical services to municipal governments regarding public records
- Funded primarily by Historical Records Trust Fund
 - Restricted receipt account
 - Fees collected by cities and towns for various land transactions and for probate filings

State Archives

- Governor recommends \$0.6 million from all funds in both years
 - ➤ \$8,549 less than requested for FY 2013 and \$9,680 less for FY 2014
- General revenues of \$90,836 for FY 2013 and \$131,705 for FY 2014
 - Reflects there are not enough restricted receipts to cover budgeted expenses

Quick Start Program

- Online master application where applicants can enter business and contact information just once
 - Information will be automatically entered on all forms the applicant needs to submit
- Some project delays and carry forward funding

Quick Start Program

- Governor recommends \$30,000 for FY 2013 for remaining work
 - ➤ Relates to integration of Quick Start and two other state agencies' operating systems
 - Consistent with the Office's request

State House Tours

- College student volunteers lead tours
- Johnson & Wales coordinates schedules and training
- Governor recommends \$12,750 in both years for a contract with Johnson & Wales to coordinate State House Tours
 - Consistent with Office's request
 - First year Governor has recommended funding
- Office spent an average of \$12,198 annually from FY 2007 to FY 2012

Other Operations

- \$0.7 million in FY 2013 and FY 2014
 - ➤ \$50,596 more than enacted for FY 2013 and \$43,441 more for FY 2014
- Includes \$23,977 in FY 2013 and \$12,902 in FY 2014 to consolidate printers and fax machines into multi-function copy machines
 - Lease-to-purchase agreement

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
