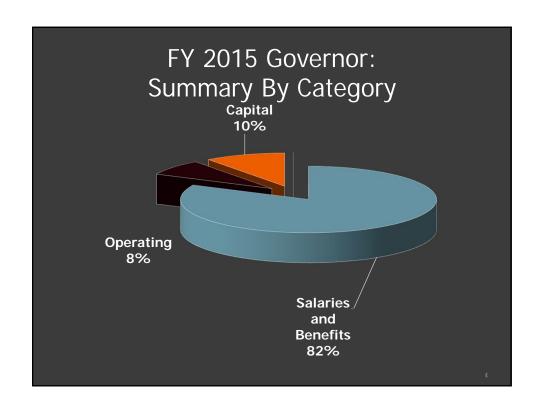

- Reactor is used for research, training, experimentation and third party projects
 - Technical assistance for disposal of low-level radioactive waste
 - Provides classroom training to URI, PC, and Brown

Target Budget

- Budget Office provided general revenue target of \$0.8 million
 - 7% reduction of \$60,875
- Commission's constrained budget met target by:
 - Layoff of 1.0 FTE: Principle Reactor Operator

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Salaries and Benefits

- \$1.0 million for FY 2014
 - \$16,840 less than enacted due to savings from updated benefit rates
 - \$4,490 less than requested to reflect statewide benefit savings
- \$1.0 million for FY 2015
 - \$21,738 more than enacted due to full year of Director's salary
 - Fully funds 8.6 full-time positions
- Currently, 7.6 positions filled

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Federal Grants

- Federal grants reduced in FY 2014 due to federal budget reductions as part of sequestration
- Enacted budget included \$209,616; none expected for FY 2015
- Federal funds were used for research and equipment costs

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Other Operations

- \$138,810 for FY 2014 revised
 - \$5,856 more than enacted
 - \$4,023 less from general revenues
- \$97,708 for FY 2015
 - \$10,605 more than enacted
 - \$7,040 more from general revenues
- For example, funds are used for building maintenance, utilities, machinery expenses

Capital Projects

- The Governor adds \$50,000 from Rhode Island Capital Plan funds for asset protection projects for FY 2015 for \$100,000 total
- \$50,000 per year FY 2016 through FY 2019
- Improving landscaping, installing a new floor, upgrading HVAC system in the laboratory wing, repairing the parking lots, and minor roof repairs

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
