#### **National Guard**

- Train and prepare members of the Army and Air National Guard and the Rhode Island Militia
- Support active forces in the defense of the nation and its national security interests
- Provide peacetime responses to state emergencies as ordered by the Governor

### **Emergency Management Agency**

- Maintain a high state of readiness for any disaster or major emergency
- Respond to emergencies and assist local governments in disaster response and recovery operations
- Increase public awareness of natural hazard risks and actions to prevent/minimize loss of life and property

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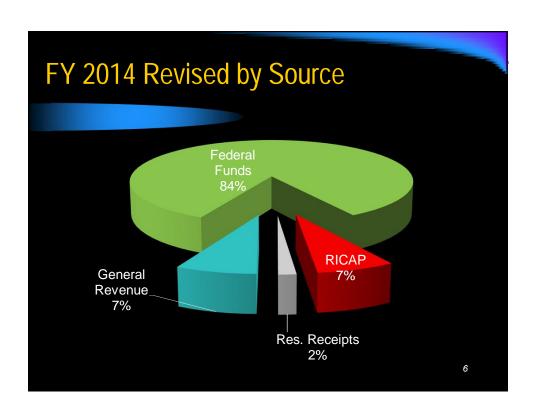

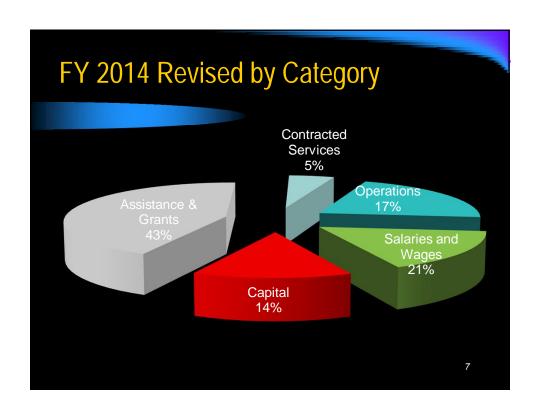

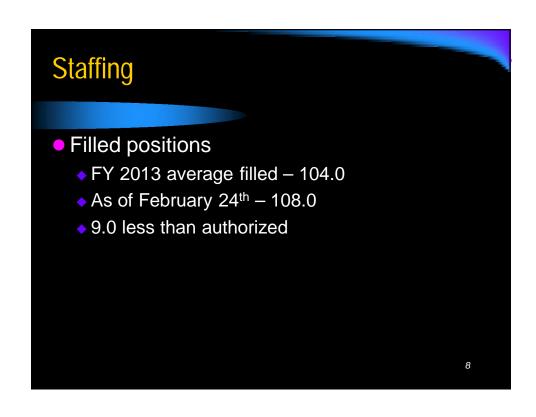
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### **Emergency Management Agency**

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### **FY 2014 Revised Recommendation**

- Salaries and Benefits
  - Reflects projected filled positions
  - ◆ \$0.1 million more than enacted
  - Approximately \$12,000 in statewide benefit savings

- Indirect Cost Recovery
  - Enacted budget includes \$0.5 million of indirect cost recoveries in lieu of general revenues
  - Approximately half was unachievable
    - National Guard federal funds not eligible
  - Governor adds \$0.2 million from general revenues to reflect achievable cost recoveries

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#### FY 2014 Revised Recommendation

- Tropical Storm Irene
  - Enacted budget includes \$5.0 million of federal funds for reimbursements to entities effected by the storm
  - Reimbursements had been made
  - Removed from the budget consistent with the request

- Emergency Management Operations
  - \$1.1 million more than enacted from federal funds
  - Consistent with the request
  - Funds used to support state and local governments to sustain and enhance emergency management capabilities for all potential hazards

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#### FY 2014 Revised Recommendation

- Disaster Funding
  - \$5.3 million more from federal funds
  - Funding from FEMA to be distributed to entities effected by
    - Hurricane Sandy \$2.8 million more
    - Blizzard of 2012 \$2.5 million more
  - Consistent with request, which reflects updated awards

- Rhode Island Statewide Communications Network (RISCON)
  - Maintain communication with all political subdivisions in the state
  - Connects EMA with Hospitals, DOH, DPS
  - Supports state and local daily operations
    - Mutual aid
    - First responders

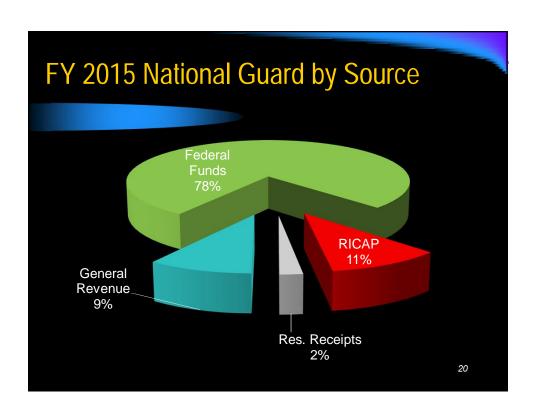
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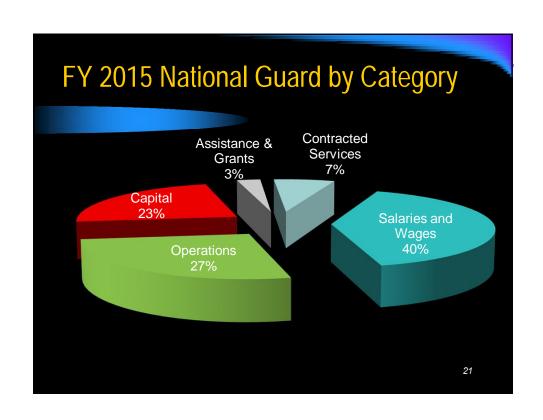
#### **FY 2014 Revised Recommendation**

#### RISCON

- Operating expenditures of \$1.2 million
- Funds contract with Motorola for 24-hour system maintenance and repairs
- \$0.5 million less than enacted from general revenues
- Reflects renegotiated maintenance contract

- Other Federal Grants
  - ◆ \$4.4 million more
  - Reflects revised awards and expenditures
  - Consistent with the request
    - Urban Areas Security Initiatives
    - Flood Mitigation
    - Homeland Security Initiatives

#### Governor's FY 2015 Recommendation

- Salaries and Benefits
  - \$0.3 million more than enacted
  - Revisions to benefits
  - Restores funding for vacant position
- Activations
  - \$75,000 more than enacted
  - Reflects funding for activation of Guard personnel for inaugurations

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#### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

- Indirect Cost Recovery
  - Enacted budget includes \$0.5 million of indirect cost recoveries in lieu of general revenues
  - Approximately half was unachievable
    - National Guard federal funds not eligible
  - Governor adds \$0.2 million from general revenues to reflect achievable cost recoveries

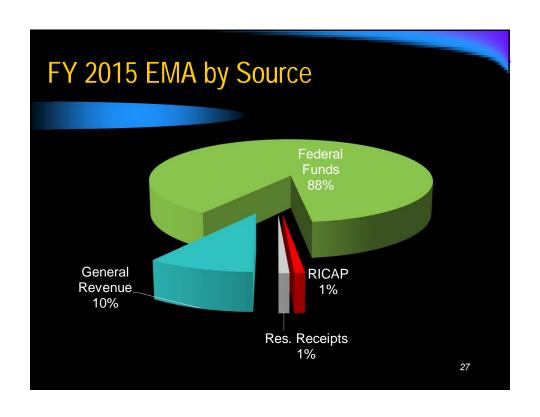
#### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

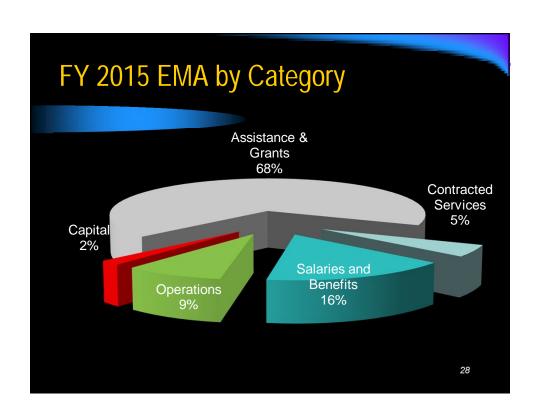
- RICAP Projects \$2.0 million
  - \$1.5 million less than enacted
  - Reflects the removal of matching funds for completed Hurricane Sandy reimbursements
  - \$0.5 million more for asset protection

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#### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

- Asset Forfeiture
  - \$142,800 of restricted receipts
  - No funding included in the enacted
  - Reflect funds available from asset forfeitures generated from the Guard's counterdrug activities
  - Would be used to purchase equipment and other supplies in support of the Guard's counterdrug operations

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### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

- Salaries and Benefits
  - \$0.3 million more than enacted from all sources
  - Revisions to benefits
  - Reflects shift of general revenue expenditures to federal sources

#### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

- RISCON
  - ◆ \$0.5 million less than enacted
  - Reflects renegotiated maintenance contract
- Indirect Cost Recovery
  - Governor adds \$0.2 million from general revenues to reflect achievable cost recoveries

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#### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

- Tropical Storm Irene
  - Removes \$5.5 million of federal funds to reflect completed reimbursements to entities affected by the storm

#### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

- Disaster Funding
  - ◆ \$4.3 million more from federal funds
  - Funding from FEMA to be distributed to entities effected by
    - Hurricane Sandy \$2.7 million more
    - Blizzard of 2012 \$1.6 million more
    - Consistent with request, which reflects updated awards

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#### FY 2015 Governor's Recommendation

- Other Federal Funds
  - ◆ \$2.0 million less from federal funds
  - Consistent with request, which reflects updated awards
    - Elimination of UASI
    - Flood Mitigation grants
    - Homeland Security
