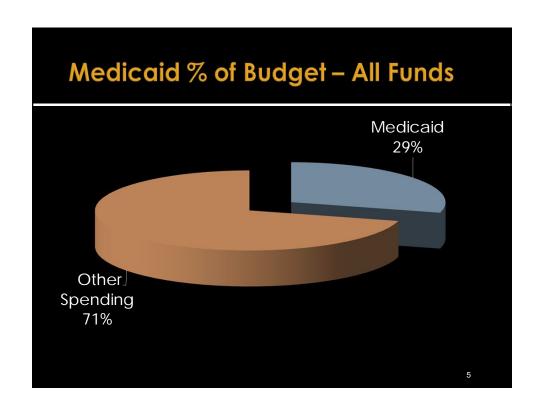

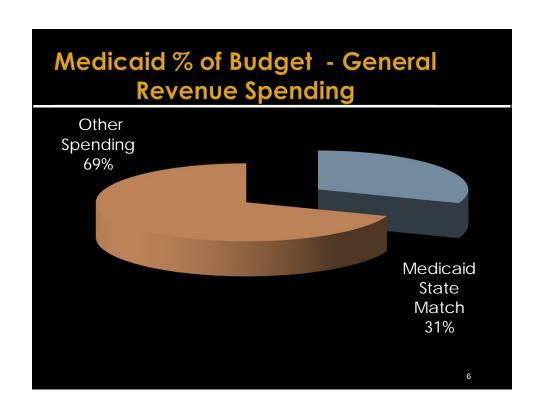

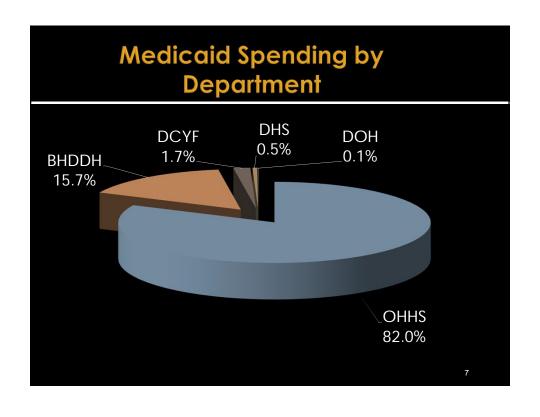

- 7% reduction of \$62.0 million
- Request is \$1,512 above the target

Entitlements - \$50 million

- \$5.7 million updated Medicaid rate that increases the state's share of costs
- \$27.0 million managed care
- \$11.4 million nursing and home & community care services
- \$2.1 million hospitals

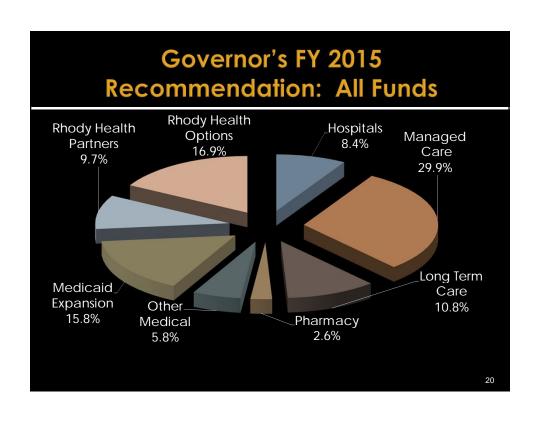
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Rhody Health Options

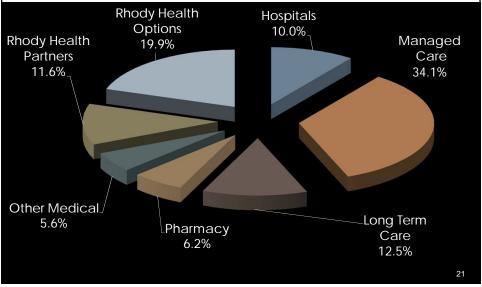
- Integrated care system for "dual eligibles"
 - Eligible for Medicare and Medicaid
- November 2013 state entered into a contract with Neighborhood Health
 - Phase I Provide acute care and long term care benefits through managed care option

 - Approximately 2,600 nursing home residents

 - Including Massachusetts, Michigan, New York, California, Ohio, Washington and Illinois





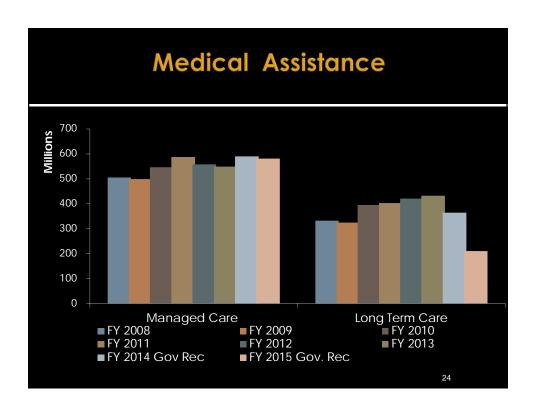


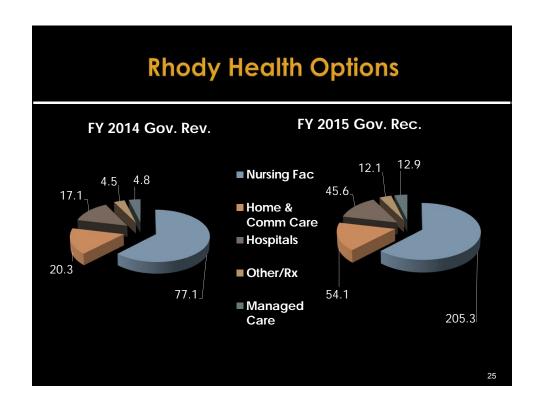

Managed Care Plans

- RIte Care: Benefits through either Neighborhood Health or UnitedHealth
 - Payments made to hospitals, community health centers, physicians and other providers
- Fee-for-Service
 - Also receive "wrap around" services through the Medicaid fee for service system
- RIte Share: Participants have access to employer sponsored benefits
 - State pays monthly cost sharing and deductibles

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RIte Care Eligibility

- Child at or below 250% of federal poverty level
 - Under ACA must retain until 9/30/2019
- Parents at or below 133% as of 1/1/2014
 - Lowered from 175%
 - Transitioned to the exchange with cost offset by the premium assistance program
- Foster Care or Adoptive Assistance
- Child with Special Health Care Needs

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Katie Beckett Option

- Governor included legislation to allow OHHS to set a monthly co-pay through its rules and regulations
- OHHS testified that change would not impact the child's eligibility
 - Still receive services
- An offset to the cost of the program
 - \$27.5 million; \$13.8 million from general revenues in FY 2013

- FY 2014 enacted budget includes savings from transitioning individuals who will obtain coverage through the exchange
- Parents above 133% to 175% of poverty who received RIte Care benefits
 - 2013 Assembly included \$1.4 million to assist parents transitioning to the exchange with monthly premiums, deductibles and cost sharing requirements
 - Can be matched by Medicaid

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Other Issues

Transitional Medical Assistance

- Current law allows the transitional medical assistance program to continue as long as federal funds are available - reauthorized through March 2014
- Program provides for RIte Care benefits for families who because of employment are no longer eligible to receive cash assistance benefits – up to 12 months or until employer sponsored insurance is available

Other Issues

DCYF - Medically fragile adolescents

- Governor includes \$1.0 million in general revenues savings in DCYF's budget from shifting costs to Medicaid through OHHS
- Funding is not included in OHHS
 - Would be matched by Medicaid
 - \$1.0 million; \$0.5 million from general revenues
- Six adolescents in out-of-state placements

Integration of Medicare & Medicaid

- Office was directed to enter into a contract to manage the benefits of Medicaid eligible individuals & those eligible for both Medicare & Medicaid (duals)
- Services include nursing care, hospitals and physicians
 - Excluded from community based services through BHDDH in the initial phase of the plan

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Nursing and Hospice Care

- Both for profit and not-for-profit nursing facilities
- Payment methodology in statute
- FY 2011 Medicaid expenses elders were
 9% of population with 26% of expenses*
- Hospitals and nursing homes were 48% of costs*

Electronic Health Records Incentive Program

- Medical providers & acute care hospitals may be eligible for incentive payments to adopt and upgrade certified health records technology
- All incentive payments to providers and hospitals are paid with federal funds
- Governor includes \$14.6 million in FY 2014 & \$11.9 million in FY 2015

- Medicaid payments have been made to 9 hospitals and over 400 providers
 - Rhode Island, Miriam, Newport, Kent County, Women & Infants, Memorial, Westerly, Roger Williams, & St. Joseph's
 - Physicians, nurse practitioners, dentists
- Payments of \$24.2 million from federal funds

Electronic Health Records Incentive Program

- Medicare payments have been made to 10 hospitals and over 450 providers - \$51.3 million
 - Rhode Island, Miriam, Newport, Kent County, Women & Infants, Memorial, Westerly, Roger Williams, St. Joseph's & South County
 - Podiatrists, optometrists, chiropractors, osteopaths and oral surgeons
- Providers have to chose between Medicaid or Medicare but hospitals can receive both payments
