# Military Staff

- Train and prepare members of the Army and Air National Guard and the Rhode Island Militia
- Support active forces in the defense of the nation and its national security interests
- Provide peacetime responses to state emergencies as ordered by the Governor

# Target Budget

 Budget Office provided a general revenue target of \$2.5 million

Current service adjustments of \$14,729

- 8.0 percent target reduction of \$0.2 million
- Constrained request reduces funding for firefighters and other staffing

Governor: \$0.2 million above the target

Did not accept constrained proposals

### Firefighters – Injured on Duty

- Injured on Duty status for firefighters, municipal police officers, sheriffs
  - Injury or illness while on duty or off-duty, if responding to an emergency
  - Full salaries and benefits
  - Included in filled full-time positions
- Employees injured after July 1, 2011
  - must return to work or apply for disability pension following new state guidelines

# Firefighters

- As of October 2013, National Guard Bureau changed how positions reimbursed
- Revision to federal funding agreement
  - Hired after FFY 2012: Reimbursed at federal pay scale maximum: \$59,617
  - Hired before FFY 2012: Grandfathered if they remain in the same position
  - Do not pay any cost for IOD



# Enacted budget funds 30 positions Gov. Rec. funds 29 positions in FY 2017 and 30 positions in FY 2018 FY 2017 - \$3.4 million \$0.1 million less than enacted – turnover savings and statewide benefit savings

- FY 2018 \$3.5 million
  - \$25,309 more than enacted



#### Shift from federal funds to gen. rev. in both years

- Firefighter salaries promotions and new hires above federal wage cap
- Military Staff intends to convert two vacant crew chief positions to firefighters
  - Reflected in proposed funding
  - No change to number of crew chiefs & firefighters in personnel roster

# Cybersecurity

 Governor includes enacted level - \$50,000 from gen. rev. each year in FY 17 and FY 18
 For National Guard participation in Governor's Cybersecurity Commission working groups
 National Guard cannot use federal funds to participate in such state programs

### **Other Salaries and Benefits**

• FY 2017 - \$0.5 million less than enacted, primarily from federal funds Additional turnover savings from vacancies FY 2018 - \$5.3 million for 62.0 FTEs \$0.3 million less from all funds Decreases of \$47,963 from general revenues and \$0.2 million from all funds

Revisions to benefits and anticipated staffing

### **Statewide Savings**

 Assessment to salaries that funds workers' comp., unemployment & unused leave

Lowered from enacted based on experience

- Savings of \$1.2 million in FY 2017
- Savings of \$1.5 million in FY 2018
- Medical benefit cost growth
  - Lower than initial estimates
    - Savings of \$2.6 million in FY 2018

Total impact to Military Staff

\$1,300 in FY 2017; \$5,042 in FY 2018

### Asset Forfeiture – Google Funds

### • FY 2017 revised - \$32,000

- FY 2018 \$29,500
  - \$7,800 less than enacted
  - RING counterdrug activities
  - Can be used for travel expenses, equipment & supplies
  - Total available to RING: \$5.0 million
    - Spent or committed \$0.3 million; Military Staff working with USDOJ to identify eligible projects

### Snow Removal

- \$0.8 million each year in FY 2017 and FY 2018 for contracted services
  - \$0.7 million federal, \$0.1 million state
  - \$0.3 more than enacted assumes heavy snow seasons
  - Master Cooperative Agreement allows approx.
     90 percent reimbursement

### **Facilities Maintenance**

#### • FY 2018 - \$4.0 million

- \$3.7 million federal funds, \$0.4 million general revenues
- \$0.6 million more than enacted
- Minor renovations and repairs
- Custodial and fire inspection
- Security services
- Primarily federally owned facilities



#### • FY 2018 - \$3.1 million

- \$2.6 million federal funds, \$0.5 million general revenues
- \$0.2 million less than enacted
  - Based on actual expenditures & anticipated usage
  - Reverse auction conducted by Office of Energy Resources - \$0.1 million in gen. rev. savings

# **Quonset Simulator Building**

- Simulator Building at Quonset Air National Guard Base
  - Building construction completed
  - Funded from federal sources
  - Platform for pilots to receive required training
  - Training for RIANG air crew, international students, and the integrated force

### **Quonset Simulator Building**

- Electricity cost estimated at \$0.4 million annually
  - Payments to begin in fourth quarter of FY 18
  - Gov. Rec: \$0.1 million for FY 2018
    - \$67,500 from fed. funds
    - \$22,500 from gen. rev. for 25% state share

### **Other Operations**

#### • FY 2018 - \$7.7 million

#### \$0.4 million less than enacted

- \$0.1 million more from gen. rev., \$0.4 million less from federal funds
- Adjustments for supplies & equipment, travel & IT expenses
- \$0.2 million less from restricted receipts for Military Relief Fund – based on historical expenditures and consistent with request

# Capital – Quonset Air National Guard Facilities

#### Quonset ANG Facilities - \$119.3 million

- National Guard Bureau funds
- Work through FY 2020
- Examples of larger projects:
  - Renovate & construct fuel cells
  - Repair & renovate operations & training facility
  - Repair base fire & crash rescue station
  - Upgrade airfield instrument landing system

### Capital – Joint Force Headquarters

### New Headquarters - \$32.4 million At Camp Fogarty in East Greenwich \$21.7 million federal, \$10.7 million RICAP Work through FY 2019 80,766 square foot, two-story building Portion of current Command Readiness Center would be transferred to EMA

 EMA has identified state-owned building; Gov. includes \$0.2 M for feasibility study

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
