- Maintains all required filings made by elected and appointed officials
 - Including Financial Disclosure Statements

Target Issues

- Budget Office provided a general revenue target of \$1.5 million
 - Current service adjustments of \$11,308
 - 10.0% target reduction of \$0.1 million
- Constrained request is consistent with the target
 - Achieved through staff reductions
 - Governor recommends \$254,463 more than target

Undistributed Savings

- FY 2018 enacted budget includes \$25.0 million of statewide savings
 - Undistributed in DOA's budget
- Governor's revised budget has proposals that total \$25.0 million
 - Not all repeat in FY 2019
- No savings assumed for the Ethics Commission

Centralized Services

- 2017 Assembly authorized establishment of internal service funds for centralized services
 - Information technology, capital asset management & maintenance, & HR
- Costs previously budgeted in DOA
 - Methodology on distribution needs review
 - Long term impacts and transparency concerns

FY 2018 Revised

\$25,000 more than enacted for legal services

FY 2019 Recommended

- \$57,001; \$25,000 more than enacted
 - Consistent with revised recommendation

Operations

FY 2018 Revised and FY 2019: \$0.2 million

- Office space lease
 - Enacted amount of \$102,500
- Other operating expenses
 - Excluding centralized services, funding consistent with enacted \$74,213
 - \$3,342 of utility savings shifted to support increased records center and subscription costs
