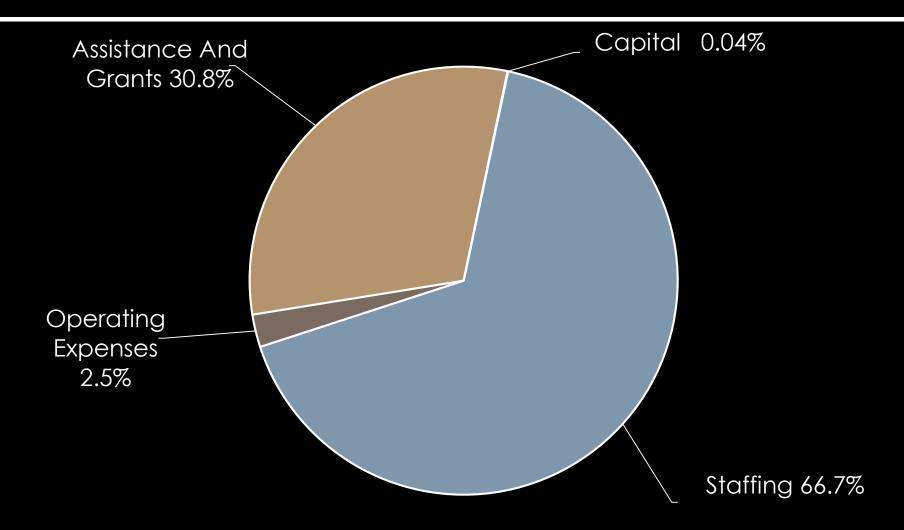
Undistributed Savings

FY 2018 enacted budget includes \$25.0 million of statewide savings Undistributed in DOA's budget Governor's revised budget has proposals that total \$25.0 million Not all repeat in FY 2019 No savings attributed to the Commission

Target Issues

- Budget Office provided a general revenue target of \$1.0 million
 - Current service adjustments of \$12,322
 10.0% reduction of \$0.1 million
- Commission's constrained request is \$4,805 more
 - Personnel cost savings and shift to other sources of funds
- Governor recommends \$69,456 more than target

Staffing

- Includes 15.6 FTE positions
- Governor's recommendation
 - Fully funds 15.6 positions
 - Includes 0.6 position for GIS Mapping
 - Requested for FY 2018; 2017 Assembly did not concur- filled Sept. 30, 2017
 - Funded through Executive Director turnover savings

- Total of \$35.0 million from G.O. bonds
 Approved by voters in November 2014
 Historical Preservation and Heritage Commission: \$5.0 million
 - Renovation and preservation of historic sites and nonprofits
- Arts Council: \$30.0 million
 - Renovations to nonprofit theaters and performance spaces

- Original program ran through 2007
 - \$5.9 million from G.O. bond funds
- Competitive application process with required match
- Current plan is \$1.0 million each for FY 2018 - FY 2020
- Governor recommends \$2.6 for FY 2018, \$1.0 million for FY 2019 & FY 2020
 - Reflects actual disbursement of funds

Sandy Disaster Relief Grants

- Assistance for rehab of historic properties damaged by Hurricane Sandy
 - Funds to property owners as reimbursements or on as-needed basis
- Governor recommends \$0.3 million for FY 2018
 - Closes the grant program

Preservation Programs

- Commission offers publications for public purchase and allows public to make copies
 - Receipts required to support operations
- Revolving Loan Fund to provide lowinterest loans to preserve properties listed on State Register of Historic Places
 - Commission maintains \$0.4 million balance to fund approved loans

Preservation Programs

- Survey and Planning RI State Survey is compilation of information about historical and archeological properties in every city and town
 - Constitutes the principal inventory of the state's historic resources
 - Activities funded from federal funds, determined by formula that changes annually
 - Governor includes \$0.6 million in each year

Other Preservation Programs

- Governor recommends \$0.3 million for 2 federal maritime heritage grants
 - FY 2018: carry over of \$52,500
 - New FY 2019 award \$0.2 million
- Includes \$0.1 million of recipient matching funds
 \$30,000 from general revenues for Fort Adams Trust Identified in Article 1

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
