Subject: Responses to Task Force Questions

Thank you again for the opportunity to appear before you and shed light on the Administration's efforts to address the COVID-19 public health emergency. The Department offers the below information in response to the outstanding questions asked at the Joint Legislative COVID-19 Emergency Spending Task Force meeting on June 9, 2020. As a follow-up to the answers we provided on July 16, 2020, this memo addresses two of remaining three questions. As always, if you require more information or need any clarification on what has been presented below, please feel free to reach out to me and my team.

SkillsRI Temporary Program

What amount of funding has been committed and spent so far for work being done by SkillsRI and any expected future allocations? Additionally, please provide detail on all tasks and accomplishments (to date and future) along with any contracts or agreements that support the expense.

Roughly \$1.25 million has been committed, including \$520,000 spent so far for work being completed by SkillsRI Temporary Program participants to fill positions related to the COVID-19 response and recovery. A total of \$1,524,464 has been made available to the SkillsRI Temporary Program.

The table below includes information about the employers accepting placements from SkillsRI and the roles being filled. Some requested placements have not been made to date and remain pending.

The attached document is the addendum of the contract between the Department of Labor and Training and SkillsRI to account for the \$1,524,464 in funding for COVID-19-related placements.
