Re: In Support of House bill 5562, titled AN ACT RELATING TO BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONS -- SOLICITATION BY CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS

The Alliance for Nonprofit Impact at United Way supports House bill 5562, An Act Relating to Businesses and Professions – Solicitation by Charitable Organizations.

As the statewide resource center for nonprofits, the Alliance for Nonprofit Impact provides capacity building, training and support for large and small community-based organizations. The Alliance also conducts an annual State of the Rhode Island nonprofit sector survey to identify challenges facing local nonprofits. We see each year that nonprofits operate with exceedingly thin margins, and limited cash reserves.

Currently, nonprofits are facing increasing levels of need in our communities. In the 2024 RI Nonprofit Survey, <u>96% of basic needs nonprofits saw demand for their services at or above pandemic levels</u>. At the same time, pandemic-specific funding has expired, and we expect significant federal funding cuts with the new Administration, raising questions about the ability of nonprofits to support their communities long-term.

State and federal grants and contracts are distributed on a reimbursement basis, so there are built in transparency and accountability mechanisms. Funding is only provided after documentation has been provided for previous expenses.

Reducing the cost burden of an independent audit for medium sized nonprofits would provide significant, immediate benefit to many nonprofits in a time when those resources are more important than ever.



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
