Re: House Bill 5813 – Cap on energy distribution fees

Dear Chair Solomon:

I am submitting the following comments on behalf of the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) on House Bill 5813 – imposing a pause on distribution and transmission fees on utility bills. This bill, while well intentioned to protect ratepayers, is problematic for several reasons. Generally, the bill would likely have the unintended consequences of ultimately costing ratepayers more over the long term for the same product or service by creating cost deferrals. Cost deferrals beyond a one-year period result in carrying costs which ultimately raise rates to customers. The following are more specific comments.

The title of a statutory section is not controlling. Therefore, this bill would likely apply to electric, gas, and water utilities, each of whom charge for transmission and distribution of their product on the consumer's bills.

The electric transmission charge that appears as a line item on customers' electric bills is based on a rate approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and while the PUC could defer increases to the resulting retail rate, the effect would be to ultimately increase the transmission cost to customers in the long term.

While the bill purports to grant an escape valve if the utility could achieve General Assembly approval, the PUC is concerned this would violate separation of powers. The legislature has delegated regulation of public utilities to the Executive Branch. Infringement on the executive branch duties would violate separation of powers. The bill may also implicate other significant constitutional issues.
