Testimony in Support of House Bill 5818, Prohibitions on advertising, political, charitable, and investor-related expenses

Dear Chairperson Solomon and Members of the House Corporations Committee:

I am writing on behalf of Acadia Center in support of House Bill 5818. This bill prohibits utilities from recovering through customer rates advertising, political, charitable, and investor-related expenses. It represents a simple and logical codification of utility cost control and ratepayer protection.

Expenses associated with lobbying or other political expenses, membership in industry trade associations, advertising/public education, and other categories prohibited here are unrelated to providing services to customers. They are undertaken to benefit the utility company and its shareholders, not customers, and, in other states, have often been shown to be misaligned with the interest of customers. As such, these expenses should be paid for by shareholders, and not by ratepayers.

Similar restrictions have passed in recent years in Connecticut¹, Maine², and Colorado³.

Here in Rhode Island, the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) does this in practice – not allowing the utility to recover such expenses through rates. However, this practice and standard for regulatory review could change based on the interpretation of different PUC commissioners or staff. Thus, we feel that there is value in codifying the categories of expenses for which ratepayers should not be responsible.

Thank you for your consideration of this important bill.
