RE: H5557 (Speech-Language Pathology Assistant bill)

Dear Chairperson Solomon and Members of the House Corporations Committee:

On behalf of the Rhode Island Speech-Language-Hearing Association (RISHA), I respectfully submit the following comments on House bill 5557, which seeks to license speech-language pathology assistants (SLPAs).

### **Section 5-48.2-8 Support Personnel**

RISHA supports the highest standards of training and preparation for our assistants. We recommend adding the underlined language and deleting the language in red:

- (2a) Complete 25 hours of documented observation of a licensed speech language pathologist, which may be accomplished within an undergraduate program of study.
- (2b) Complete twenty (20) one-hundred (100) clinical hours under the supervision of observation of clinical practice with a licensed speech language pathologist.

# **Scope of Practice**

For the scope allowances section below, RISHA recommends adding the underlined language:

(2) (b) Scope of practice of speech-language pathology assistants. A licensed speech-language pathology assistant shall only engage in those duties that adhere to the code of ethics of the board and are planned, designed, and supervised by a licensed speech-language pathologist, including:

<u>Developing low-tech augmentative and alternative communication materials for students, patients, and clients.</u>

For the scope prohibited section below, we recommend adding the underlined language:

(2) (c) A speech-language pathologist assistant shall not engage in the practice of speech-language pathology, including the following:

Selecting augmentative and alternative communication systems or devices;

<u>Treating medically fragile students, patients, and clients without 100% direct</u> supervision by a licensed speech-language pathologist.

### Licensure vs Registration

RISHA recommends adding the underlined language and deleting the language in red:

(13) (d) A speech-language pathology assistant (SLPA) shall be <u>registered licensed</u> at the department and be required to <u>re-register renew their license</u> every two (2) years.

RISHA supports licensure, rather than registration, for SLPAs.

# Section 5-48.2-9 Supervision and Responsibility

Regarding SLPAs, we recommend adding the language below to this section:

Before the SLPA begins to provide support independently, the supervising SLP must have first contact with all individuals on the caseload. First contact includes establishing rapport, gathering baseline data, and securing other necessary documentation to begin (or continue) the plan of care for the student, patient, or client.

# **Additional Language**

RISHA recommends adding the following title protection language:

No person shall hold themselves out to be, or use the title speech-language pathology assistant, unless they are licensed by the state to practice as such.
