Re: H.7514, An Act Relating to Commercial Law – General Regulatory Provisions – Protecting Rhode Islanders from Coercive Economic Tactics at Grocery Stores

Dear Chairman Solomon,

The undersigned members of the Rhode Island Business Coalition oppose House Bill 7514 which we believe while intending to level the playing field for small businesses in buying goods from suppliers as larger employers, would have a negative impact on smaller retailers.

The legislation defines covered goods as eligible foods and consumer packaged goods excluding gasoline, prescription drugs, tobacco, and alcoholic beverages. In addition, the channel of trade definition goes far beyond just grocery stores to also include mass merchandisers, online retailers, discounters, convenience stores and other retail platforms.

We recognize the intention of this bill is to help small employers, however we believe it could have unintended consequences. We are concerned that enforcement will be difficult and therefore unable to achieve the goals of the legislation. In addition, the legislation could deter manufacturers and suppliers from wanting to do business in Rhode Island. This would place small retailers in our state at a distinctive relative to their competitors across the country.

For these reasons, we ask that the Committee take no action on House Bill 7514. Thank you for your consideration of our position on this legislation.
