Hello Rhode Island State Elected Officials,

We are reaching out to express our family's strong opposition to giving residency to the three businesses currently creating tremendous concern in South County.

We have tried to keep an open mind in regard to the science of the proposed technologies. We have done our best to try and educate ourselves outside of local bias.

As well, we have reached out to folks living in the West Davisville neighborhoods to inquire what their experiences have been so far with noise and odor. We have connected to six families all of whom express having suffered. They express tremendous worry and concern about the health implications as they learn more and more about the toxic emission issues current and potential if the three businesses are passed through and offered residency.

They also express concern for property values. As we would well imagine you are all aware, the Davisville area adjacent to Quonset is very densely populated. While we fully recognize Quonset zoning is industrial, there are also many other oversight guidance principles in place that make it clear, many types of industrial businesses are not suitable for space located so close to such dense population centers. Nor is it a proper fit for land area that sits directly on top of the sole source aquifer that supplies drinking water to our town of North Kingstown. Add the additional fact that the Narragansett Bay sits directly adjacent on the eastern borders of Quonset Park, there is overwhelming evidence to support the fact that these three potential businesses must work to find alternative placement.

We fully comprehend the position state leaders find themselves as the requirement to find solutions to our shared responsibility to determine appropriate placement - - especially for the sludge that is created by all of us. Yet, we place our confidence in all of you, that the process will allow you time to better study and fully comprehend the needs. We have confidence that in time, the correct path forward in suitable placement options will be determined.

We will be keeping a very close watch as the situation progresses and will look forward to all of our state legislators working for what is in the best interest of the health, well being and safety of our citizens, the essential protections of our natural resource of the Aquifer and the Bay. As well, to represent those homeowners key investments whose properties sit within a one mile radius.
