Dear Committee Members and House Leadership,

We strongly support the proposed version of H8400 that has had the expiration date removed. I respectfully ask that you vote this bill out of committee, recommending passage by the full chamber during this legislative session.

The citizens of North Kingstown do not want a sewage sludge pyrolysis plant in their community. Recent public comments have highlighted grave concerns regarding the accumulation of mercury—a known neurotoxin with long-lasting generational impacts—and benzene, an established class 1 carcinogen for which no safe exposure limit is known. With over 20 other hazardous particles and emissions documented in the pyrolysis plant's minor source air permit application, it is clear that these facilities do not belong in the middle of our homes, schools, and sole water sources. We do not need to wait on commission results to tell us this is the wrong place for this type of technology.

Beyond the immediate need to protect community health, the expedited timeline and negligible public comment opportunities early in this facility's process have severely damaged the community relationship with the Quonset Development Corporation (QDC), an entity critical to both the town and state economy. Passing this bill without an expiration date will give the community the confidence that a new pyrolysis plant under a different LLC is not waiting right around the corner. This foundational safety is a critical precursor to bolstering and repairing the QDC-North Kingstown relationship that has served the state so well over the last several decades.

We are finally getting to settle into retirement and are hoping to stay in the home we built. However we will not stay in an unhealthy space where we are being slowly poisoned. We will be devastated if we are forced to move because of decisions made for the Town of NK that do not consider the safety, needs and desires of the residents.
