For over 50 years, CCHR has been working to protect the mental health human rights of individuals of all ages.

Families in Rhode Island need a Parents' Bill of Rights and I am grateful to the Representatives sponsoring this very good bill. This bill has been referred to the House Education Committee and for this reason I am contacting you in support of this bill. It is my hope that as a member of this committee you will VOTE YES when this bill is heard.

If Rhode Island simply passed this section of H 7781, this would help to protect the 200,000 or so children of the state:

23-100-3. Infringement of parental rights.

(a) The state, any of its political subdivisions, any other governmental entity, or any other institution may not infringe on the fundamental rights of a parent to direct the upbringing, education, health care, and mental health of their minor child without demonstrating that such action is reasonable and necessary to achieve a compelling state interest and that such action is narrowly tailored and is not otherwise served by a less restrictive means.

(b) For purposes of this chapter, the term "parent" means a person who has legal custody of a minor child as a natural or adoptive parent or a legal quardian.
