RE: H 7294 – An Act Relating to Fish and Wildlife – Field Trials and Shooting Preserves – Captive Hunting Prohibited

Dear Chairman Bennett,

Thank you for providing the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) the opportunity to comment on H 7294, which would prohibit the importation of any animal into the state for purposes of captive hunting. DEM supports this legislation with one technical amendment for your consideration.

Importation of animals from outside the state into Rhode Island for hunting purposes poses several threats to people and wildlife. The imported animals, particularly cervids such as deer or elk, may carry destructive diseases such as chronic wasting disease that pose a threat to Rhode Island's native wildlife. Furthermore, some animals that could be imported to be hunted, such as pigs, are destructive to property and difficult to eradicate if they were to escape the premises where the hunting occurs. Finally, DEM believes that the practice of captive hunting as described in the legislation is at odds with hunting ethics such as the concept of fair chase.

DEM proposes the following amendment to the legislation to maintain consistent language across related statutes:

(d) The term captive hunting shall not apply to the release of upland domestic game birds for hunting whether on public property or on private property properly licensed by the department of environmental management as a shooting preserve.
