Testimony in support of H7357: High Heat Waste Facility Act

To Chair Bennett and the honorable Members of the House Environment and Natural Resources Committee:

The "SECTION 1. Findings" of H.7357 succinctly summarizes the good reasons why high-heat waste facilities must be prohibited:

- they emit highly toxic pollutants,
- pose unacceptable threats to the health and safety of Rhode Islanders and the environment,
- are the most costly method of waste disposal,
- and energy derived from the combustion of solid waste, and from the combustion of fuels derived from solid waste, is not renewable energy.

Consequently, it is in the best interest—and a moral mandate—for Rhode Island to protect our communities, environment, climate, and natural resources by prohibiting the construction and operation of solid waste incinerators, waste-to-fuel facilities, waste-to-chemical facilities, and other high-heat waste facilities.

For more comprehensive information, please also refer to the Conservation Law Foundation's March 30, 2023 testimony of last year's version of the bill (2023 H5142)¹, which I wholeheartedly support and which equally applies in favor of this year's H7357.

I urge you to bring H7357 to a vote in 2024.
