Please support the bill that requires the Department of Transportation to plant native plants, shrubs and trees along our roads and highways. Here's why:

- Doing so will lower the cost of maintaining the roadsides throughout the state. Native plants require less mowing, watering and herbicides.
- Mowing costs time and money. Labor, equipment maintenance and cost of fuel. The DOT uses a huge amount of gas, polluting the air that we breathe.
- Native plants have deep root systems which improve stormwater management and erosion control, stabilize slopes and reduce vegetation overgrowth.
- Native plantings out-compete invasives - Reduces invasive species spread/vegetation overgrowth.
- Native plants support pollinators and wildlife. Highways cut through critical wildlife corridors, so native plants planted along roadsides can become long, continuous pollinator pathways.
