Chairman Abney and Members of the House Committee on Finance,

On behalf of the Coalition for a Multilingual Rhode Island we'd like to support House Bill 7594 "Bilingual, Dual Language, and World Language Teacher Investment Act." If passed, this act would establish a scholarship program for bi/multilingual undergraduates and adults interested in becoming bilingual / dual language and world language educators at schools in the urban core or urban ring areas of RI. Rhode Island stands to benefit immediately from this legislation as there has been a historic shortage of educators, both nationwide and in our state, and this would decrease the financial barriers and create alternate pathways and programming for licensure, particularly for adults and non-traditional learners.

Passage of House Bill 7594 is imperative for growing the bilingual workforce in our state. Rhode Island has a wealth of multilingual adults who need clear guidance and financial support to obtain licensure. While we see enclaves of school administrators traveling to Spain and other countries to seek bilingual teachers to meet the needs of our growing Multilingual Learner (MLL) population, we are ignoring the immense talent that exists here in Rhode Island.

There is increased demand for Bilingual/Dual Language and World Language Teachers, as evidenced by the growing number of emergency certifications issued in recent years. According to the Annenberg RISSA Report on Rhode Island Statewide Staffing, 734 current teachers are new hires. New hires are on average 38 years old, 16% are teachers of color, and 52% are certified in high-needs areas. In comparison, returning teachers are on average 47 years old, 7% are teachers of color, and 41% are certified in high-needs areas. In short: new hires are younger, more diverse, and more likely to be in high-needs areas. But turnover is higher for teachers in these same categories.

Preparing the next generation of teachers is critical. 40% of the workforce is 50+ when it was 30% a decade ago. Increased funding allocated to support MLLs often goes toward professional development initiatives, when it should prioritize teacher certification. Teacher certification fulfills professional development requirements, while professional development alone does not fulfill certification requirements. Furthermore, while there has been some emphasis on ESOL certification, we know that this certification alone is insufficient to meet student needs. Students require bilingual, dual language and world language teachers to improve

academic literacy in their home languages and establish a comprehensive multilingual pre-K to 12 system.

With that, I urge you to support the passage of this bill. Uplift our multilingual communities. Embrace the linguistic and cultural diversity of our students. Sustain our heritage languages. Thank you.
