RE: In support of Representative Donovan's H7251, the Early Educator Compensation Stabilization Act

Dear Chair Abney and members of the House Finance Committee,

We write in strong support of Representative Donovan's bill, H7251, to help address the early educator workforce staffing crisis in Rhode Island.

For 190 years, we at Children's Friend have worked to advance the well-being and healthy development of the youngest and most vulnerable children in Rhode Island. Today, alongside our permanency and nutrition services, we provide vital early learning programs across the birth to 5 continua, including family home visiting, early intervention, Early Head Start, Head Start, child care and Pre-K. For the families with whom we work, over 90% are earning less than the federal poverty level. Our Pre-K, child care and Head Start classrooms are a lifeline that enables the parents to go to work each day and strive for a better future for their children.

As Rhode Island rebuilds from the COVID-19 pandemic, we are seeing children with greater challenges - making the job of teaching our youngest children even harder and more important. At the same time, we are facing a significant staffing crisis. Due to years of underinvestment in these programs by the state, we struggle to hire assistants and teachers.

Representative Donovan's bill would fund two initiatives to encourage current staff to remain in the field, which the system desperately needs. We especially support investments in continuing the WAGE\$ program that has a proven track record of improving retention of credentialed early educators. Wage supplements for front line teachers are a worthwhile investment for Rhode Island to make in our children.

We urge you to pass this bill -- the staffing crisis is not showing signs of lessening and our children deserve to have access to the services we want to be able to provide.
