SUBJECT: Support for House Bill 5464

Dear Chair Abney and Members of the Committee:

Our organizations appreciate the opportunity to submit testimony on House Bill 5464 by Representative Tanzi. This vital legislation would make Rhode Island's casinos smokefree by repealing the exemption they were granted in the Public Health and Workplace Safety Act. Rhode Island needs to stop gambling with the health of our casino workers. A brave group of casino employees has taken a stand against the harmful, smoke-filled work environment that they endure every day, and we strongly support their efforts. We hope the committee will, too.

Casino gaming is the only industry in Rhode Island that is permitted to jeopardize the health of its employees by allowing smoking indoors. The rest of Rhode Island's hospitality industry has been smoke-free for **20 years**. During the pandemic, the gaming floors were smoke-free and patrons who wished to smoke had to do so outside. That temporary smokefree policy has ended and employees are once again being exposed to the harmful chemicals in secondhand smoke.

People who use tobacco are not the only ones who breathe the deadly smoke – everyone around them is forced to inhale it too. Secondhand smoke causes nearly 20,000 deaths, including over 4,100

lung cancer deaths among nonsmoking adults each year in the United States.^{i, ii} Exposure to secondhand smoke causes many of the same tobacco-related diseases as active smoking, including heart disease, stroke, and cancer.ⁱⁱⁱ In addition, secondhand smoke increases the risk for sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), acute respiratory infections, ear problems, and more severe asthma in children.^{iv} **Multiple Surgeon General's reports have confirmed that the scientific evidence indicates there is no risk-free level of exposure to secondhand smoke.^{v vi}**

Twenty states and territories, including New York and Massachusetts, already prohibit smoking in casinos.^{vii} Mohegan Sun and Foxwoods in Connecticut are also smoke-free.

It is unfair to prioritize the casino industry over the health concerns of hard-working employees who have been ignored for too long. Rhode Island's casino employees deserve equality. It's time to address this injustice and close the casino loophole once and for all. Everyone should have the right to breathe clean air where they work. We urge you to recommend passage of House Bill 5464. Thank you for your consideration.



There is no safe level of exposure to secondhand smoke.

- A 2023 air quality report on fine particulate matter levels (PM2.5, an indicator for secondhand smoke) in non smoke-free casinos was 5.4x higher than in smoke-free casinos.
- Eliminating environmental (indoors or outdoors) secondhand smoke exposure is the only proven way of avoiding health impact.
- HVAC systems reduce odor and discomfort but cannot eliminate secondhand exposure.
- HVAC systems instead distribute toxic secondhand smoke.
