

Follow up and additional information to my previous email.

In the 1980s and 1990s there were as many as six Liquified Natural Gas (LNG) ships stored / "mothballed" in Narragansett Bay. These ships were brand new and had not previously been used. They were 964 feet long and were initially moored in Coddington Cove and and later moved to Davisville. The ships were originally intended to transport LNG from Libya to the USA. I believe they were owned by Shell Oil.

These ships were not left to rot. Indeed, they were maintained to be ready for future employment and to prevent loss of an immense financial investment. They had maintenance crews that worked on all systems of the ships during the day and fire/safety watches at night. They required subcontract services from all manner local and regional businesses, including paying municipalities for police and fire coverage. These ships brought millions of dollars, each year, into the economy of the State of R.I..

In the 1990s (I don't remember the exact date) the remaining 3 ships were to be sold. It was my understanding that the ships, although under a new owner, were to remain at their current berths with an accelerated maintenance program. At approximately the same time, the State of R.I. tried to impose a new sales tax on the sale of the multi, multi-million dollar ships. Again, it is my understanding, that the sale was delayed, the ships were towed to Virginia and the sales completed. The result was, we lost the jobs; lost the business; lost the revenue.

I believe that the pertinent take-away should be that taxes on boats is short sited. The amount of income generated by the proposed taxes is dwarfed by monies infused into the region and by the monies expended by boat owners to support their boats and ships. Also consider the loss of the aforementioned monies when the many Rhode Islanders can't afford to buy and maintain their boats with additional TARIFFS levied against them.


