There are over 1300 marine related jobs in RI which surely will be affected by less boaters. These institutions should remain places where people can gather, learn, and enjoy the water without excessive financial barriers.

In the end, taxation will negatively impact local businesses, individual access and local yacht clubs from the enjoyment of the resources in our communities. We MUST not allow this additional tax to be passed which will directly impact on our residents and visitors to Rhode Island and only incentivize large investments presence to price all of us out of our waters.
