Dear Chair Abney and Members of the House Finance Committee,

I am writing on behalf of Farm Fresh Rhode Island in strong support of H5534, a bill that would extend essential tax benefits to Rhode Island's small and urban farms.

Rhode Island's tax laws governing farms were written 40 years ago when the agricultural landscape looked very different. Today, we are home to a vibrant and growing network of small and urban farms— more than 250 across the state—that play a vital role in feeding our communities, stewarding our environment, and building a stronger local economy. Unfortunately, these farms are currently excluded from the tax relief available to larger farms, despite facing many of the same financial pressures.
