RE: H5200 - An Act Relating to Education - Rhode Island Early Educator Workforce Act

Dear Chair Abney:

I am writing to you regarding House Bill S5200, which aims to strengthen and sustain the early childhood education workforce by funding scholarships, apprenticeships, and compensation programs for early educators across the state. While the proposal's goals may appear to align with the work of the RI Department of Human Services (DHS), I am sharing additional information and context for the committee's consideration.

Since 2017, DHS has allocated consistent funding to the TEACH Early Childhood program, which provides needed scholarships to help early educators earn credentials and degrees while continuing to work. On average, DHS has invested approximately \$750,000 per year to support eight TEACH pathways and the Registered Apprenticeship program, which collectively help early educators earn more credentials that eventually leads to increased earning potential. Importantly, DHS has secured ARPA SFRF funds to support TEACH through March 2026 and will be actively reviewing data on program participation and pathway selection to inform future investments.

Another way the early childhood education workforce is being supported is through the WAGE\$ program. This program builds on the TEACH and apprenticeship program by boosting early educator compensation and retention with education-based salary supplements. This has been supported for the past two years through Preschool Development Grant funding with additional funding expected to sustain the initiative at a minimum of \$1 million per year through 2028.
