In the past, I have gone without healthcare because I could not afford it on my salary, working in early education. With the help of the TEACH program, I returned to school and earned my bachelor's degree in 2018 at 67. My degree is in teaching pre-K through grade 2. I could quickly go into the public school system. Teachers are in demand. Doing so would also afford me the benefits of teaching in the public system. However, despite this, I have chosen to stay in the ECE field.

I am very invested in this age group, infants and toddlers, and with my current center. I enjoy working with this age group. I am passionate about watching children grow, develop, and become independent. I love watching the children discover the world around them.

The Wage\$ supplement was a massive help to me. Early childcare centers were deemed essential during the pandemic; therefore, early educators were not part of the population receiving extra unemployment benefits. My car was beginning to give me some problems. The money helped with a down payment. The money was also used to help me get caught up on my utility bills.

Additionally, I was able to start a savings account. At Christmas time, I donated to my neighborhood's little free library. This helped to purchase books that were used as Christmas gifts for children in the area. I was also able to buy some new things for my center.

The cost of living has increased. Food, utilities, interest paid, health care, and rent are sky-high. Most early childcare workers make minimum wage or just above. These funds helped my family and other families immensely. I do not qualify for any state assistance because my children are grown. Enrollment is low, and the owner cannot afford to pay raises. I could go to McDonald's and make a higher hourly wage.

We have these little lives in our hands each day. It is a huge responsibility. I am not looking to get rich quickly; however, I would like to be able to pay my bills and be financially comfortable.
