I plan to expand my school to offer more high-quality early education to young students, especially those of color. I want every child in RI starting school already reading, writing, understanding math, and being aware of the rest of the world and its cultural and scientific place. And I will need all the financial resources and skills to make it happen. This is RI's vision for future generations, right?
