Although working with young children is very rewarding, it is also exhausting. Classroom teachers are 100% responsible for just about everything, from children's learning to the safety and welfare of the whole classroom and meeting expectations (ECERS-CLASS-Professional development-IEP's-Assessments). After being in a classroom for six hours nonstop, teachers feel physically and mentally exhausted, only to have to do aftercare. Because of this, teachers are constantly sick and calling out. There is a lack of subs because agencies can only afford to pay them so much. In return, teachers are left with less help and more stress. Since most teachers make very small wages, it is easy to transfer to other jobs where they can get paid more and have fewer responsibilities, stress, and demands. Early childhood teachers feel underappreciated and often referred to as babysitters. They don't see the importance of high-quality classrooms and well-educated teachers in this field. Please continue to fund WAGE\$; it helps ECE teachers to survive financially.
