- It promotes equity and addresses teacher shortages. Multilingual learners in Rhode Island are primarily located in under-resourced



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districts. This bill expands access to high-quality programs in those communities and helps build a pipeline of qualified bilingual educators by removing certification barriers. This directly aligns with our mission at the Equity Institute, as it will enable more passionate and capable multilingual individuals to enter the teaching profession, enriching our schools and providing students with relatable role models.
