We've been participating in the RIte @ Home Shared Living program for about 12 of the 14½ years. She has had a stroke in 2010 which has left her right side weak and cannot walk well. She also had a heart attack in 2014. She is currently on dialysis. Has been for 8 years. I take care of my mothers' finances, make sure she has all of her medications, take her to all of her medical appointments, etc, as she cannot.

I know I am not the only one that cares for a loved one at home, taking care of all caregiver responsibilities and duties and dont have anoyone to turn to for help.
