## Portsmouth School Committee Resolution RE: Out of District Transportation Resolution

**WHEREAS**, in 1977, the Rhode Island General Assembly enacted § 16-21.1 establishing five school bus regions based on the location of the then ten career and technical (CTE) centers, and there are now over 250 CTE programs statewide, and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, in addition to transporting students to public CTE centers, § 16-21.1 also requires transportation for students attending private and parochial schools, and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, eighty-five percent of private school transportation comes out of region three, placing a financial burden on public school districts in that region, resulting in some of the highest transportation costs in the state, and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, according to the Legislative Commission studying the statewide school bus transportation system, the cost of transporting students outside their home districts could reach \$40 million in FY 2025, and,

<u>WHEREAS</u>, according to the Commission, public school districts could save approximately \$3.5 million if the number of regions were increased to nine and reconfigured, and,

<u>WHEREAS</u>, 2025–H 6236 by Representative Terri Cortvriend and 2025 S–0972 Senator Linda Ujifusa would increase the regions to nine and also reconfigure them, and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, mindful of the impact on private school students, H 6236 & S 0972 would hold those students and their families fiscally harmless by grandfathering them in until July 1, 2029,

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the savings from reducing the size of transportation regions would be used to create a fund to help offset the cost of long-distance, high-cost statewide transportation of homeless students, students in foster care and those in high-cost special education programs,

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** That the Portsmouth School Committee urges the Rhode Island General Assembly to enact H 6236 & S 0972, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** A copy of this Resolution should be forwarded to every State Senator, State Representative, and the Governor.
