Dear Chairperson and Members of the House Finance Committee,

I am a registered dietitian and the project coordinator for a research study on early childhood nutrition at Brown University. I am writing to voice my support for the passage of H-5536.

Food-insecure individuals face multiple barriers to consistently acquiring healthy foods. Farm Fresh Rhode Island's Bonus Bucks initiative offers SNAP recipients \$1.00 in SNAP credits to be used at farmer's markets for every \$1.00 they spend on produce, thereby expanding access to fresh fruit and vegetables. With up to thirty-eight percent of Rhode Islanders facing food insecurity last year, 1 it is imperative that we support efforts to establish food equity.

Since its implementation in 2009, Farm Fresh Rhode Island has supported the economy by independently raising and administering \$1.7 million in Bonus Bucks to local food vendors. This bill also has the potential to prevent major healthcare burdens, as high fruit and vegetable intake is associated with a reduced risk of developing chronic diseases such as cardiovascular disease, type 2 diabetes, renal failure, and certain cancers.

H-5536 would cement an effective program into our state's efforts to foster a healthy population and a strong local economy. I urge the Finance Committee to support this bill. I thank you for the opportunity to submit my testimony.
