**RE: 2025 H-5995 – Relating to State Affairs and Government – Department of Human Services**

Dear Chairman Abney:

I am writing on behalf of the Department of Children, Youth & Families (DCYF or “the department”) regarding H 5995, which would provide \$3,000 stipends for individuals who successfully complete a job training program and the department’s probationary period. Please consider the additional information below when evaluating this legislation.

This bill identifies to two specific positions: Social Caseworker I and Child Protective Investigators (CPI). Please note, however, that there are no Social Caseworker I positions at DCYF – there are Social Caseworker II (SCWII) positions.

Next, the department already provides a job training program for individuals hired into the CPI or SCWII positions. There is no determination regarding which new-hires are eligible for it, though, as mentioned in this bill – all new CPIs and SCWII go through this 23-week program. It is unclear if H 5995 would apply to individuals who complete this program or if it would require the department to develop something new that is only available to certain “eligible” persons.

Finally, providing a \$3,000 stipend to individuals would require additional financial resources from the department. At the end of the 2023 legislative session, the General Assembly enacted a pilot program that changed the hiring process at DCYF for these two positions. DCYF now conducts Civil Service Exams – the exam that a person must pass before being hired – on a monthly basis. This increased frequency means that DCYF hires new individuals regularly, and requiring this stipend could cost close to \$200,000 per year.

Thank you for allowing the department to submit testimony outlining its concerns regarding this legislation.
