The Protect Our HealthCare Coalition is a group of leading Rhode Island non-profits and consumer groups with a shared mission to protect, improve, and expand equitable access to quality, person-centered, affordable health care for all.

We strongly **support House Resolution 6017** because **we are deeply concerned about the persisting issue of food insecurity in Rhode Island, which is a critical social determinant of health**. The Governor's proposed allocation for the Food Bank represents a cut of \$250,000 at a time when the Food Bank is serving more Rhode Islanders through its member agencies than ever before **and in the face of deep cuts to SNAP benefits being voted in Congress**.

According to the RI Life Index, the level of food insecurity in our state remains alarmingly high, with 38% of households with children reporting that they cannot afford adequate food. <sup>1</sup>

House Resolution 6017 will increase the Food Bank's budget allocation to a total of \$1 million (adding \$450,000 to the Governor's proposed \$550,000), helping bring nutritious food directly into low-income households as a safeguard against chronic food insecurity, and helping to ensure the health and wellbeing of our families, kids, and older adults.

We urge the Committee's support.
