Re: **SUPPORT House Resolution 6190 – Medicare-Medicaid Dual (MMP) Ombudsman Program**

The Protect Our Healthcare Coalition is a group of leading Rhode Island non-profits and consumer groups with a goal to protect, improve, and expand equitable access to quality, person-centered, affordable health care for all.

We write in support of House Resolution 6190 to sustain the Medicare-Medicaid Dual Ombudsman Program. The Governor's FY26 Medicaid budget proposes to eliminate the program as of December 31, 2025.

Sustaining this program is critical. It provides assistance to people who are eligible for both Medicare-Medicaid, a population of primarily medically fragile Rhode Islanders who face significant challenges in accessing care due to their overlapping forms of coverage and high medical needs.

The Ombudsman Program helps these Rhode Islanders navigate challenges and system complexities, troubleshoot eligibility, and contest claim denials. The program, housed at RIPIN, helps about 400 people every year and has saved Rhode Islanders more than \$2 million in healthcare costs since its inception in 2016 (and \$343,189 during FY24).

At a time when accessing healthcare and navigating complex systems seem only to be getting worse given the chaos and uncertainties at the federal level, we must do all we can to ensure that quality programs such as the Medicaid-Medicare Dual Ombudsman Program remain in place for the people of Rhode Island.

We urge you to support House Resolution 6190 to appropriate the small amount of funds needed to sustain this critical program.
