

The State Archives are located in leased space without permanent exhibit capacity, preventing many irreplaceable documents from being safely displayed. Treasures such as the Gaspee Commission documents, the Battle of Rhode Island map, and historic printings of the Bill of Rights and Declaration of Independence deserve a secure and visible home where Rhode Islanders, students, and visitors can learn from them.

The proposed History Center would provide dedicated exhibit and learning space within the State government complex, complementing State House tours and strengthening Providence as a cultural and educational destination. As our nation approaches its 250th anniversary, creating a permanent home for Rhode Island's history would be a fitting legacy project that invests in civic education, heritage tourism, and public pride.

Preserving and sharing our history is not a luxury — it is a responsibility. I respectfully urge you to support this legislation and help ensure Rhode Island's history is protected and made accessible for generations to come.
