Re: H7127, Governor's FY 2027, FY 2026 Revised and Capital Budgets, Department of Health

Dear Chair Tanzi and members of the Committee,

My name is Debra Quinton, and I am an RN and the Director of the First Connections Program at Family Service of RI. I am writing regarding the Department of Health's FY'27 proposed Budget and the important need to adequately fund the State's First Connections Program. I request that the Department of Health designates funding to support the First Connections Program to ensure the continued critical work we do for RI families.

Our program is the state's child find entity for Early Intervention, and the short term, immediate response program to connect families prenatally and with children under the age of 3 years old. We support the Governor's budget, but we recommend that DOH puts a specific line item to fully fund the costs associated with non-Medicaid reimbursement.

First Connections Teams are made up of Pediatric and Perinatal Registered Nurses, Certified Community Health Workers and Social Workers. Interventions include finding children who have not returned to their pediatrician, conducting safety assessments of family homes including lead, asthma, and fire risks and conducting developmental screenings for every child under the age of 3 who has touched the DCYF system.

In 2025, we received more than 4000 referrals. My dedicated team outreached and serviced many of these babies and their families assisting them with support and overall health education to reduce maltreatment and neglect. I urge you to support our critical work by establishing dedicated funding within the RIDOH annual budget.
