**Re: Support for H7127 – Public Safety Budget**

Chair O'Brien and members of the committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide this letter in support of the \$400,000 included in H7127, the Governor's FY27 proposed budget for the Department of Public Safety for GO TEAM® funding. We appreciate the Governor's and General Assembly's continued support over the past two years with this budget allocation. We are also deeply grateful for the strong and collaborative partnership we share with Colonel Weaver and the Rhode Island State Police, whose leadership and commitment have been instrumental to the success of this work. Together, along with our local law enforcement partners, we have built a model that ensures victims of crime, particularly children, receive immediate, trauma-informed support in moments of crisis. **I respectfully request that for FY27, this funding be increased to \$760,000 to allow for the expansion of the GO TEAM® partnership to six additional Rhode Island communities.**

For the past 20 years, FSRI has partnered with police departments across the state to provide 24/7/365 joint response services for victims of crime, with a particular focus on children exposed to traumatic events. The GO TEAM® currently partners with the Providence, Pawtucket, Central Falls, Woonsocket, Newport, Barrington, and Rhode Island State Police Departments. With additional state investment, these partnerships could expand to include the North Providence, East Providence, Middletown, Jamestown, South Kingstown, and New Shoreham Police Departments.

Through this innovative model, an FSRI police liaison rides along with officers, responding directly on-scene to provide crisis intervention and stabilization aimed at reducing the immediate and long-term impact of trauma. Each year, the GO TEAM® serves hundreds of crime victims, prioritizing our state's most vulnerable residents- children and families experiencing trauma. This partnership allows officers to focus on public safety and investigative responsibilities, while remaining confident that victims are receiving compassionate, professional support during and immediately following their victimization. In recent months, the GO TEAM® has played a critical role in coordinating on-scene crisis response and trauma support following the mass violence incidents at Brown University and the Pawtucket ice rink.

Additional funding will allow Rhode Island to expand this highly effective, trauma-informed model and ensure that more communities have access to critical crisis response services when they are needed most. I urge the committee to move forward with the expanded \$760,000 budget allocation for the GO TEAM®.

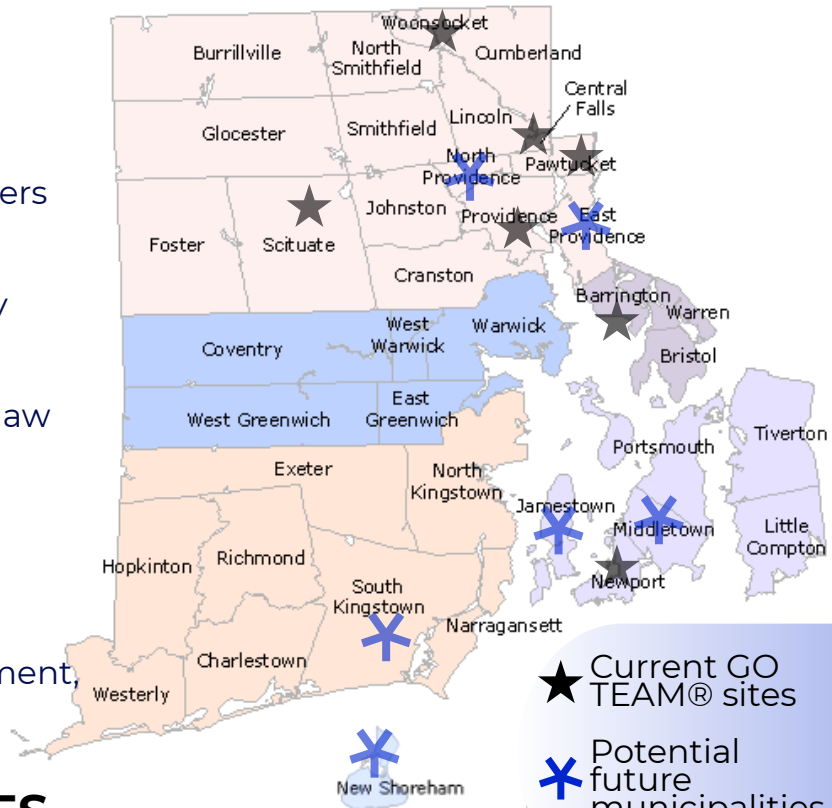

## SUMMARY

GO TEAM® is a nationally award-winning program first developed by FSRI in 2004 as a best practice for responding with police on scene to child victims and witnesses exposed to violence and other traumas. We currently have trauma trained police liaisons co-located in Woonsocket, Central Falls, Pawtucket, Providence, Newport, Barrington, and the State Police.

## FUNDING

Family Service of Rhode Island would like to thank the Governor and the Legislature for the investment of \$400,000 for FSRI's GO TEAM®. The funding supports our current GO TEAM® partnerships.

We respectfully request to increase our funding to a total of \$760,000. This will support implementation and partnership with:

- North Providence Police
- East Providence Police
- Middletown Police
- Jamestown Police
- South Kingstown Police
- New Shoreham Police

This expansion will:

- Increase, if not double, the number of children and families we serve
- Allow our trauma trained police liaisons to provide:
  - On-scene crisis intervention and behavioral stabilization
  - Co-riding with police on patrol
  - Court and language support
  - Care coordination, safety planning, and basic needs assistance
  - Support to address the effects of child- trauma exposure
