Re: H.7810, An Act Relating to Taxation – State Tax Officials

Dear Chairman Abney,

The undersigned members of the Rhode Island Business Coalition wish to register our strong support for the passage of H.7810, An Act Relating to Taxation – State Tax Officials and thank Representative Shallcross Smith for introducing this legislation.

H.7810 reduces the interest rate charged to delinquent payments from 18% to 12%. While many states charge 6% interest on such accounts, this proposal to move to 12% is a positive step in the right direction.

In addition, the bill would have the state follow the federal Internal Revenue Service (IRS) guidelines regarding tax audits. The IRS can go back three years from the date of the audit notice to conduct tax audits on taxpayers unless fraud is a question, at which point the IRS may go back seven years.

For this reason, many businesses retain tax documents and receipts for seven years. We have been told that the Division of Taxation may conduct audits outside the seven-year look-back provision of the federal government. This places Rhode Island businesses in a precarious situation if that business destroyed old documents, thinking the federal guidelines apply.

These changes would assist those taxpayers who end up owing more in interest than in the actual amount of delinquent tax owed to the state. It would also provide an incentive for the Division of Taxation to address delinquent taxes in a timely manner.

Thank you for your consideration of our position on House Bill 7810 and we ask for the committee's support.
