Role in Elections

- Board of Elections and Secretary of State's Elections & Civics Division are charged with different responsibilities
 - Complementary tasks, many of which are mandated by Rhode Island General Laws

Role in Elections

Board of Elections

- Supervises all elections
- Instructs and certifies all election officials assigned to polls
- Trains poll workers
- Prepares and distributes poll worker guides and related materials

Secretary of State

- Provides municipalities with forms for candidates
- Certifies federal and state candidates for ballot placement
- Prepares state and local referenda
- Describes and explains state referenda in Voter Handbook

Role in Elections

Board of Elections

- Prepares and delivers voting machines and supplies to polling places
- Conducts recounts
- Certifies election results to Secretary of State
- Conducts voter registration drives

Secretary of State

- Publishes guides for candidates, election officials, and voters
- Provides ballot information and polling place locations on website
- Prepares and prints ballots
- Maintains central voter registration system

Election Expenses COVID 19

- Predominantly mail ballot elections held in September, November, & March 2021
- Revised budget includes \$1.8 million from CARES Act for Sept. & Nov. elections
 - March special election cost \$958,391 from general revenues
- Governor's recommendation removes use of federal funding in FY 2022
 - Aligns general revenues similar to FY 2018 expenses; the last non-election year

Election Expenses

- Help America Vote Act Election Security
 - \$1.8 million in FY 2022 & \$0.4 million in FY 2021
 - Governor's budget excludes \$1.4 million awarded in FY 2021
 - GBA requested April 12, 2021 to include funding
 - Funding supports
 - Update of the Central Voter Registration System, cybersecurity, e-poll books, mail ballot equipment, risk-limiting audits

eGov Initiative

- Multiple IT projects
 - Redesigning the Open Meeting Interface
 - Restructuring the Business Services Database
- FY 2022 \$0.5 million from general revenues
 - \$229,639 less than enacted
 - Reflects average cost of projects from FY 2018 to FY 2020
- FY 2021 \$0.7 million
 - Consistent with the enacted budget

State Archives

- \$0.3 million in FY 2022 & \$0.4 million in FY 2021
 - Funding split between restricted receipts and general revenues
- Moved to new space at 33 Broad St.
 - 10 year lease starting August 2020
 - 11,234 square feet
 - Includes more exhibition, meeting, & research space

State House Programs

- Tour Program
 - FY 2021 revised & FY 2022 \$40,000
 - Consistent with enacted budget
 - Provides tours of state house to children and adults
- Visitor's Center
 - \$25,000 in FY 2021 revised & FY 2022
 - Same as enacted
 - Funds the Visitor's Center & Gift Shop

Grants

- Appropriations to community organizations identified in Article 1
 - \$125,000 to the Rhode Island Historical Society
 - \$18,000 to the Newport Historical Society
 - Funding provided is to care for, preserve, and catalog the property of the state
 - Consistent with the enacted budget

Capital Projects

- Election Equipment
 - \$0.2 million from RICAP for equipment in FY 2023
 - 200 AutoMark tables, 500 privacy booths, and other equipment
 - Expected to last multiple elections
 - Consistent with approved capital plan
