I am writing in support of companion bill H-5351 that propose all medical professionals and aesthetic professionals in Rhode Island may work and delegate to the full extent of their scope of practice.

RIDOH is limiting access to the services I have been receiving from my current aesthetic practitioner. I have been told I will no longer be able to receive Botox, dermal filler, laser hair removal, microneedling, and platelet-rich plasma.

As someone who has personally benefited from aesthetic treatments performed by highly skilled NPs and RNs, I can attest to the exceptional level of care, expertise, and safety they provide. Aesthetic medicine is not just about appearance, it boosts confidence, supports mental well-being, and allows individuals to feel their best. 
By passing the Bill the state would:
